Course Overview

This class is intended for wildlife rehabilitators, Animal Control Officers, and others who may be called upon to provide basic supportive care for orphaned, ill, or injured native wildlife, or work with the public to resolve issues involving wildlife. - 3. Safe capture and handling / Personal Safety
- 4. Health concerns for rehabilitators
- 5. Intake and well baby exam (including hands-on exam activity)
- 6. Hydration and fluid therapy (including injection practice lab)
- 7. Feeding and nutrition
- 8. Wellness, enrichment, and preventive medicine
- 9. Release criteria

Wildlife Rehabilitation Basics: Advanced Topics Course ID kr002

Course Overview

This class is intended for wildlife rehabilitators, Animal Control Officers, and others who may be called upon to provide emergency, short-term, or long-term care for orphaned, ill, or injured native wildlife, or work with the public to resolve issues involving wildlife. The course builds on basic skills utilized in well-baby care, focusing on the following topics:

- 1. Intake and triage for ill or injured animals
- 2. Quarantine and sanitation protocols for ill and injured animals
- 3. Working with your veterinarian for medical management
- 4. Parasitology identification of common parasites, treatment protocols
- 5. Infectious and zoonotic diseases identification, prevention, treatment protocols. Includes discussion of public health risks
- 6. Pain Management
- 7. Wound Management
- 8. Calculating medication dosages for wildlife
- 9. Euthanasia (includes review of AVMA Guidelines for Humane Euthanasia)
- 10. Case Studies
